

As Term Four nears its end, we look forward to our water safety week and our Open Day on December 15th at Hamilton West before heading into block courses in January and Term One in 2025.


SWIMMER SPOTLIGHT

SOPHIE MAKES A SPLASH IN ITALY

In September this year Sophie Hay travelled to Alghero, Italy to compete at the 2024 World Aquatics Junior Open Water Championships. Sophie was accompanied by swimmers Alex Dunkley, Larn Hamblyn-Ough and Jack Portier with our very own Head Coach, Mat Woofe, leading the team.

Sophie competed in two events, the Women's 7.5km and a new event to the Open Water Championships the 3km Knockout Sprint.

The weather although great for a European summer holiday, made for tough racing conditions as temperatures were up into the 30's.



Day 3 saw Sophie compete in the 3km Knockout Sprint, a new event to the competition lineup being dubbed the "skins of open water" and consisting of three rounds. The first leg is 1500m, the second leg is 1000m and the final leg 500m. The first round was delivered via two heats, with only 10 swimmers from each heat progressing through to the following round. Sophie was in heat 2 and led the second pack of swimmers. She touched the pad in 18th placing her 37th overall.

Upon evaluation of her performances Sophie said "Although I didn't get the results I was hoping for it was a really good learning experience and I came home with a lot of knowledge about racing the best from other countries. I am very grateful for the experience.". World Champs was Sophie's second ever international competition with NSW Open Water Championships being her first.


